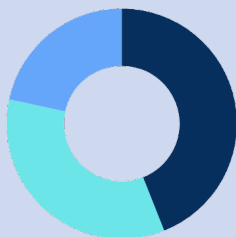

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Aug. 1, 2025) - Gov. Andy Beshear congratulated the 1,050 outstanding high school seniors from 117 counties across the commonwealth who recently completed the 43rd Kentucky Governor's Scholars Program (GSP). For more than four decades, the residential summer program has focused on enhancing Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders through educational and career opportunities at college

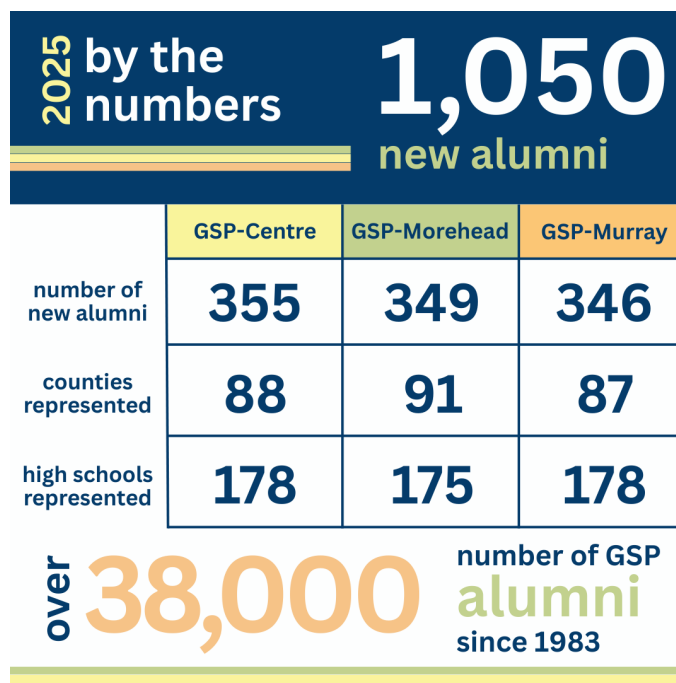

Planning for the 44th Summer

2026 Student Application Timeline

Sep 2, 2025: Selection packets mailed to schools & districts.

Jan 9, 2026: Deadline for districts with one school, private schools, or homeschools to mail applications.

Jan 23, 2026: Deadline for districts with more than one school to mail applications.

April 13, 2026: Latest date for GSP to mail notifications to students.

May 1, 2026: Last day for students to accept or decline their appointments.

May 19, 2026: Notifications mailed to Scholars of session, campus and class assignment.

And just like that, planning is already underway for the summer of 2026. Our team is traveling around the state recruiting high school juniors to apply, training school officials on the application process, and searching for our next faculty and staff applicants.

Alumni Highlights

Andy Beshear ('95) was a scholar on the GSP-Northern Kentucky University campus from Henry Clay High School in Lexington. After graduating from high school, Gov. Beshear studied political science and anthropology at Vanderbilt University where he earned



a bachelor of arts degree in 2000. He then attended the University of Virginia School of Law, receiving his JD in 2003. Gov. Beshear worked as a lawyer for White & Case LLP in Washington D.C. before being hired by Stites & Harbison and eventually returning to Kentucky. He served as Kentucky's 50th Attorney General from 2016 – 2019, and is currently serving as the 63rd Governor of Kentucky. He and his wife, First Lady Brittainy Beshear, along with their two children, Will and Lila, live in Frankfort and are members of Louisville's Beargrass Christian Church.
