

Did you know? Kentucky County Trivia




Bell County: Middlesboro is one of only a few cities on the North American continent located in the basin of a meteorite impact structure (<u>learn more</u>).

2026 Student Application Timeline

Jan 9, 2026: Deadline for districts with one school, private schools, or homeschools to mail applications.

Jan 23, 2026: Deadline for districts with more than one school to mail applications.

April 13, 2026: Latest date for GSP to mail notifications to students.

May 1, 2026: Last day for students to accept or decline their appointments.

May 19, 2026: Notifications mailed to Scholars of session, campus and class assignment.
